Fellowship Programme in Psychological Counselling

Introduction

During MBBS Internship training, there is two-week rotation in Psychiatry, but the exposure to wide variety of cases in psychiatry may not be adequate to have confidence to provide effective psychological counselling independently. This lacuna can be filled by the one-year fellowship in psychological counselling. Different institutes across the globe are having such fellowship programmes.

In our Institute we are having a well-established Postgraduate Department in Psychiatry providing holistic services in psychiatry and psychological counselling covering preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative aspects. Department is having well qualified Faculty consisting of Professor, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, Senior Resident and Postgraduate students in MD Psychiatry. Also posted with a highly experienced Clinical Psychologist. Department provides holistic outpatient and inpatient psychiatric and psychological services to various kinds of diseases like psychosis, substance use disorders, anxiety disorders, mood disorders, geriatric problems, relationship issues, marital counselling etc. All facilities including a 30 bed well equipped inpatient ward, Psychometry lab having all kinds of test materials for projective tests, personality tests, Intelligence tests etc, Biofeedback equipments and Electro convulsive therapy modalities are also available. In addition to the above, department is actively involved in various intradepartmental, interdepartmental research activities, community outreach services in organized medical camps etc. To cater for the large student population of Institution of about 3,000, a Positive Mental Health Clinic also is being run by the department.

With this additional qualification of Fellowship in Psychological counselling, Medical graduates can also position themselves in large set up at metro cities & big cities to take our institutes name to higher level.

There will be formal structured teaching, lecture, seminars, case presentations with respect to the curriculum topics. Candidates will be given hands on training by experienced faculty and PG residents. During the Fellowship, candidates will be expected to participate in one state/national/international conference & present paper, poster. Candidates will be expected to publish one paper during the year. Candidate shall be maintaining a log book for the entire course. At the end of training there will be a written exam consisting of two papers of 100 marks each & practical/viva examination of 100 marks. After successful completion of the course, the candidates will be awarded a "Certificate of Fellowship in Psychological Counselling" at the Annual Convocation Programme / annual Day.

SOP/ Regulations for the fellowship programme in "Psychological Counselling"

1) Title of Programme, Programme objective, Year & date of Implementation

Title - Fellowship in "Psychological Counselling"

Objective -

- a) To train the medical graduate students in "Psychological Counselling"
- b) To upgrade the Department of Psychiatry by developing Fellowship programmes.
- c) To highlight the prestige of PIMS (DU) through different fellowships.
- d) To initiate research work in Psychiatry and Psychology.
- e) To avail the facility of such fellowship in rural area & giving the rural psychiatric services as good as in metro cities.
- f) To develop high standard in provision of Mental Health Services which will in turn attract the medical graduates from all over India & contribute towards the progress of the PIMS (DU).

Year & Date of Implementation- The Course will start on 01 Aug and terminate on 31 July of the following year.

2) Eligibility of the programme

- MBBS students who have completed one-year Compulsory Rotating Internship in a NMC recognized Institution.
- Overseas candidates will have to obtain MCI registration of their Medical Graduate degree before joining.
- PIMS (DU) may conduct entrance examination if there are more than five applications, otherwise candidates will be selected by an interview board to be headed by Dean DBVPRMC and Prof & HOD Psychiatry and Prof & HOD Community Medicine as Members.

3) Duration -

One calendar year with two semesters

40 Credits (20 Credits each semester)

Candidates will be expected to publish one research paper & attend one state/national / international conference & present paper or poster.

5) Curriculum Delivery/Transaction

Over the year candidates will have seminar, Case presentation, Journal club, and lectures in the afternoon session twice week. Detailed programme can be prepared for the full academic year.

6) Programme outcome

After completing the fellowship programme, the candidates will be confident in identifying, interviewing and to provide appropriate psychological tests and counselling to patients and their caretakers.

7) Examination & Evaluation Methods

• Evaluation:-

Term end examination will be arranged and conducted by Dept. of Psychiatry, Dr. Balasaheb Vikhe Patil Rural Medical College and declare the result.

Examination Scheme

Paper – I: Fellowship in Psychological Counselling–I

Paper – II: Recent advances in Fellowship in Psychological Counselling

Theory Examination:- (2 Paper of 100 marks each)

2 LAQ x 20 Marks = 40 Marks

6 SAQ x 10 Marks = 60 Marks

Practical Examination:-

One Long Case / Long experiments = 50 Marks

Three Short Cases (3 x 30) = 90 Marks

Viva Voce / Oral / OSPE / Spottes = 60 Marks

Minimum Passing:-

- i) Minimum 50% in Theory papers (Each paper minimum is 40%)
- ii) Minimum 50% in Practical / Clinical & Viva Voce
- iii) Overall 50% Theory & Practical/Clinical

Award of class:-

- 50% to 59.5% = IInd class
- 60 to 74.5% = Ist Class
- Above 75% = Ist Class with Distinction

Attempts:-

- A student shall clear the Examination only within three attempts or within 4 years of admission.
- Result / Issue of Mark Sheet – Head of Institute & HOD will jointly issue the Mark Sheet.

Certification:-

- A) Title – Fellowship in Psychological Counselling.
- B) A fellowship is awarded upon successful completion of the prescribed study program, which will state that i) Candidate has completed the prescribed course of Fellowship in Psychological Counselling, ii) Candidate has completed prescribed clinical experience. iii) Candidate has passed the prescribed examination.
- C) Certificate will be issued with the signatures of concern Dean, Dr. Balasaheb Vikhe Patil Rural Medical College & Vice-Chancellor, Pravara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed to be University).
- D) Certificates to be prepared by concern College.
